Game to Arisons from California, 1962; listed as Jacob Walts, Territorial Census, April 1964, 3rd District (Iavapai County) age 54, born in Germany, eccupation-Miner, resident in Arisona 2 years; again listed as Jadob Walts, U.S. Census, 1880, at Phoenix, age 70, born in Prussia, eccupation-Farmer, the name of Jacob Walts appears on the Great Register of Maricopa County for 1876, 1882 and 1886 as a resident of Phoenix, born in Germany, aged 66, 72 and 76; the Great Register also indicates that he was naturalised as an American citizen on July 19, 1861, at Los Angeles, California, in the Court for the 1st District. He and Jacob Wiser had possession of the "Lost Dutchman Mine" in the Superstition Mountains; Wiser is and to have died at the rench of John D. Walker, near Florence, A.T., about 1881.

Died at Phoenix, Maricopa County, A.T., <u>October</u> <u>8</u> 18<u>91</u>; buried old Pheenix City (Pioneers) Constery, Block 19, grave 4; a monument to his memory erected at Apache Janction, Pinal County, by the Done Club of Phoenix.
